# COVID-19 MEDICATIONS

## Monoclonal Antibodies

COVID-19 medications called monoclonal antibodies can help people ages 12 and older fight their illness. Monoclonal antibodies are given by intravenous (IV) infusion or injection.

**If you are sick with COVID-19, medication can stop you from getting even sicker, and help shorten the amount of time you are sick.** You may be able to get medication if:

- ✓ You test positive for COVID-19.
- ✓ Your symptoms started less than seven days ago.
- ✓ You are not hospitalized.

**Most COVID-19 medications are free, but there could be other costs or fees. If you have insurance, provide that information when you get the medication. If you do not have insurance, ask the health care provider or pharmacist about any costs.**
